Section 1 Bulbs – Cut Flowers

Hyacinths

1. One Spike **Hyacinth**, any colour
2. Three Spikes **Hyacinths**, one cultivar, any colour

Tulips

3. One Bloom **Tulip**, any colour, single/double
4. Three Blooms **Tulips**, one cultivar, any colour, single/double

Daffodils

5. One Bloom **Daffodil**, Division One, all yellow
6. One Bloom **Daffodil**, Division One, other colours
7. One Bloom **Daffodil**, Division Two, white perianth
8. One Bloom **Daffodil**, Division Two, yellow perianth
9. One Bloom **Daffodil**, Division Three, yellow perianth – coloured corona
10. One Bloom **Daffodil**, Division Three, other colours
11. One Bloom **Daffodil**, Division Four
12. One Bloom **Daffodil** Division Six
13. One Stem **Daffodil** Division Five, Seven or Eight
14. One Bloom **Daffodil** Division Eleven



15. Three Blooms **Daffodils** Division One all yellow, one cultivar
16. Three Blooms **Daffodils** Division One other colours, one cultivar
17. Three Blooms **Daffodils** Division Two yellow perianth, one cultivar
18. Three Blooms **Daffodils** Division Two white perianth, one cultivar
19. Three Blooms **Daffodils** Division Three, yellow perianth, one cultivar
20. Three Blooms **Daffodils** Division Three, white perianth, one cultivar
21. Three Blooms **Daffodils** Division Four, one cultivar
22. Three Blooms **Daffodils** Division Six, one cultivar
23. Three Blooms **Daffodils** Miniature, one cultivar (from approved list)
24. Five Blooms/stems **Daffodils** more than one cultivar, in vase
25. Six vases **Daffodils** one bloom per vase, 6 cultivars, from at least 3 divisions, one cultivar per vase.
26. Three vases: **Daffodils** 3 blooms per vase, 3 cultivars, one cultivar per vase

R.A. Scamp Challenge: (Restricted to members of The Caley with a Daffodil only available to members at the Autumn lectures)

27. One Bloom

28. One Bloom **Irish-bred Daffodil**

Historical Varieties Challenge

29. Three blooms **Daffodil** of one cultivar, registered before 1947, in one vase
MUST BE NAMED



Section 2 - Bulbs in Pots

One Bowl, Pan or Pot not exceeding 2 litres or 17cms in diameter:

30. Three **Hyacinths**, one cultivar, blue/mauve
31. Three **Hyacinths**, one cultivar, red/pink,
32. Three **Hyacinths**, one cultivar, any other colour
33. Five **Tulips**, any colour, one cultivar
34. **Tulips** any species or miniature (not less than 5 bulbs)

35. **Daffodils**, Division 1, one cultivar
36. **Daffodils**, Division 2, one cultivar
37. **Daffodils**, Division 3, one cultivar
38. **Daffodils**, Division 4, one cultivar
39. **Daffodils**, Division 6, one cultivar
40. **Daffodils** from Divisions 5, 7, 8, 10, 11 or 12 except miniatures
41. **Daffodils**, Miniature species or hybrids, one cultivar
42. **Daffodils** Division 13, species or natural hybrids

Section 3 – Intermediate Classes

An intermediate entrant is someone who has never won more than three first prizes, or a cup at any spring show in the intermediate, equivalent or open classes in any spring show.

Cut Flowers (Intermediate)

43. One Bloom **Daffodil** Division One
44. One Bloom **Daffodil** Division Two
45. One Bloom **Daffodil** Division Four
46. One Bloom **Daffodil** Any other division



Cut Flowers (Intermediate) continued

47. Three Blooms **Daffodils** Division One, one cultivar
48. Three Blooms **Daffodils** Division Two, one cultivar
49. Three Blooms **Daffodils** Division Four, one cultivar
50. Three Blooms **Daffodils** Division Six, one cultivar
51. Two vases: Three blooms **Daffodil**. Two different divisions (one cultivar/division per vase)

Bulbs in Pots (Intermediate)

One Bowl, Pan or Pot not exceeding 2 litres or 17cms in diameter :

52. **Daffodils**, Division 1, one cultivar
53. **Daffodils**, Divisions 2 or 3, one cultivar
54. **Daffodils**, Division 4, one cultivar
55. **Daffodils**, Division 6, one cultivar

Section 4 – Novice/Beginner Classes

A novice/beginner is someone who has never won more than three first prizes or a cup at any spring show. Plus previous prize-winners in the open section in any show are not eligible to enter Intermediate or Novice/Beginner classes

Cut Blooms (Novice)

56. One Bloom **Daffodil**, Division One
57. One Bloom **Daffodil**, Division Four
58. Three Blooms **Daffodils**,(one cultivar)



Bulbs in Pots (Novice)

One Bowl, Pan or Pot not exceeding 2 litres:

59. One pot **Tulips**, any colour
60. One pot **Hyacinths**, any colour
61. One pot **Daffodils**, any colour
62. One pot any other **Bulb, Corm or Tuber**

Section 5 - Other Spring Bulbs

One Bowl, Pan or Pot not exceeding 17cms outside diameter












63. **Chionodoxa**
64. **Fritillaria**
65. **Scilla**
66. **Muscari**
67. Any spring flowering alpine or woodland **Bulb, Corm or Tuber** (excluding entries with designated classes eg. Daffodil, Hyacinth, Tulip, or Scilla etc)

Section 6 - Others

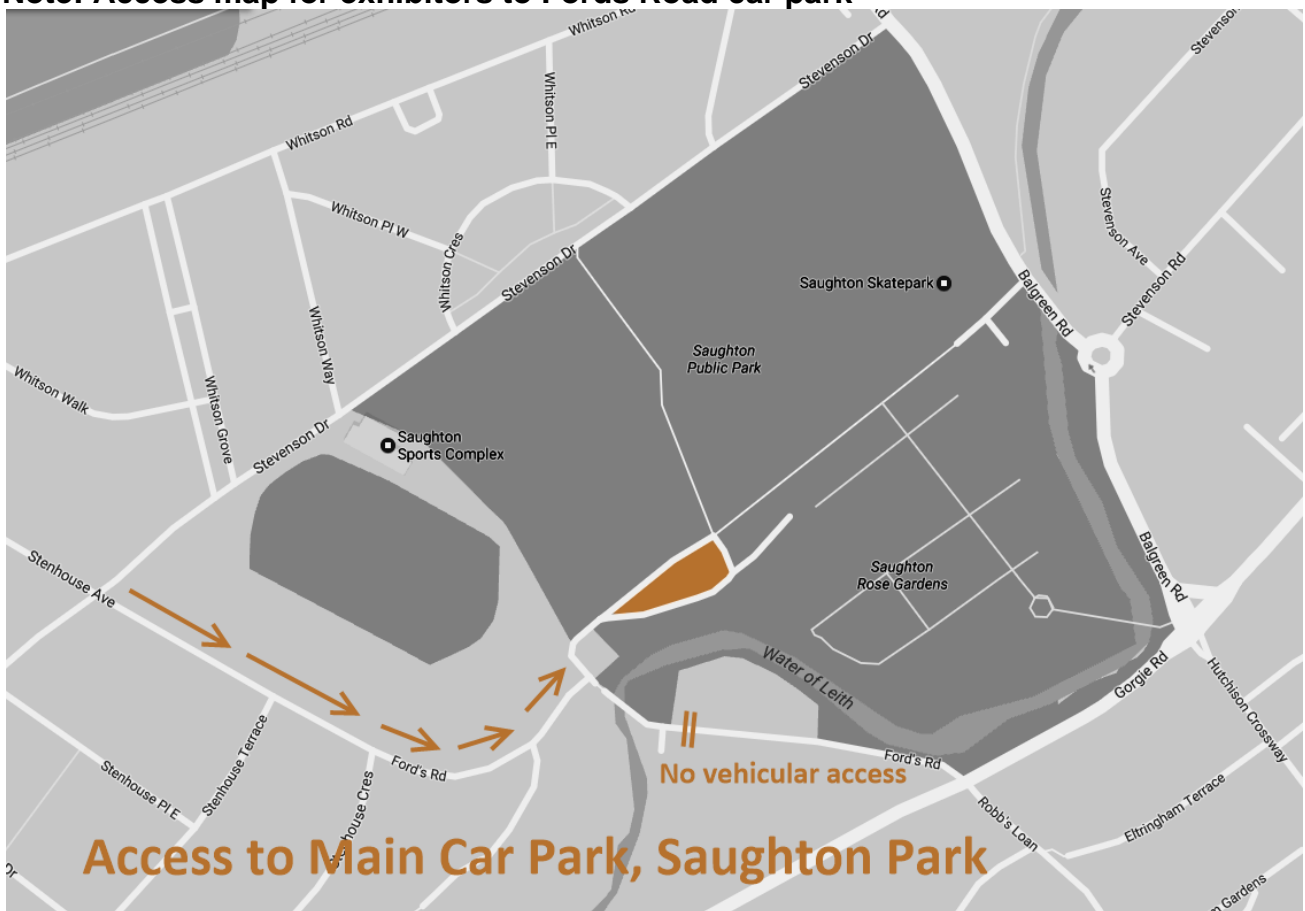
68. **Hippeastrum (Amaryllis)** (Pot size not exceeding 2 litres)
69. One vase **Flowers arranged for display** may include Daffodils
70. Six **Floating Flowers** of any kind in a container

Show Regulations

- 1) Entry for Members and Non-members to all Classes is **free** (donations are welcome).
- 2) Completed Entry Forms should be emailed to springshow@rchs.co.uk by the Wednesday prior to the Show, or handed in when staging exhibits on the Friday before the show.
- 3) Staging for all Classes can commence at 2.00pm on the Friday until 8pm. Parking is available at the Fords Road entrance near the main display area at Saughton Park.
- 4) All cut flower and exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitors themselves and been in their care for not less than **three months** prior to the Show.
- 5) A competitor may enter only one exhibit in any one Class
- 6) Except where otherwise stated, all exhibits must be shown in vases supplied by the Show organisers. Staged exhibits can only be moved under the supervision of the Show Co-ordinator or Show Manager.
- 7) Class cards will be provided and should be placed face down beside the exhibit. Cultivars should be named or if not known, labelled "Unknown": labels and wire to hold labels will be supplied by the Society. Pots must be clean and placed on paper plates supplied by the Society.
- 8) Judging will take place between 8.45am and 11:45 on the opening day. There will be strictly no admittance to the marquee during judging.
- 9) Daffodils will be judged in accordance with Daffodil Society rules, with other exhibits judged according to the RHS Horticultural Show Handbook.
- 10) While every reasonable precaution will be taken to safeguard exhibits, the Society cannot accept responsibility for exhibits which are damaged, lost or mislaid during the Show.
- 11) Exhibits not according to Schedule and exhibits deemed unworthy by the Judges, will not be awarded prizes. Plants or material judged to be diseased will be removed. Judges at their discretion may make additional awards where merit warrants, and their decision on merit shall be final.
- 12) Where two equal first prizes are awarded, the sum offered for 1st and 2nd prizes will be divided equally between the two competitors.
- 13) Appeals relating to judging must be made to the Show Co-ordinator in writing, together with a deposit of £2.00, before 4.00pm on the first day of the show. The deposit will be returned if the Appeal is upheld.
- 14) **Prize money may be collected between 3.00pm on Saturday and 3.30pm on Sunday of the show. Uncollected prize money will be deemed to be a donation to The Caley. If winners wish to donate their prizes to the society, they are encouraged to speak to the Treasurer as Gift Aid can often be added to donations.**
- 15) Exhibitors are responsible for ensuring removal of their own exhibits **after** the Show closes on the Sunday.
- 16) If possible, trophies will be engraved before the Trophy Presentation on the final day. Otherwise, in order to allow engraving, award winners are requested to return Trophies to the Show Co-ordinator before the Show closes.
- 17) Trophies must be returned to the Show Convenor in good order before the 2023.

Prize money is awarded as follows: 1st (£2), 2nd (£1) and 3rd (£0.50) places in all classes
