# Schedule of Classes

## Section 1 Bulbs – Cut Flowers

### Hyacinths

1. One Spike **Hyacinth**, any colour
2. Three Spikes **Hyacinths**, one cultivar, any colour

### Tulips

3. One Bloom **Tulip**, any colour, single/double
4. Three Blooms **Tulips**, one cultivar, any colour, single/double

### Daffodils

5. One Bloom **Daffodil**, Division One, all yellow
6. One Bloom **Daffodil**, Division One, other colours
7. One Bloom **Daffodil**, Division Two, white perianth
8. One Bloom **Daffodil**, Division Two, yellow perianth
9. One Bloom **Daffodil**, Division Three, yellow perianth – coloured corona
10. One Bloom **Daffodil**, Division Three, other colours
11. One Bloom **Daffodil**, Division Four
12. One Bloom **Daffodil** Division Six
13. One Stem **Daffodil** Division Five, Seven or Eight
14. One Bloom **Daffodil** Division Eleven
15. One Bloom **Daffodil** | Orange Perianth
16. Three Blooms **Daffodil** Division One all yellow, one cultivar
17. Three Blooms **Daffodil** Division One other colours, one cultivar
18. Three Blooms **Daffodil** Division Two yellow perianth, one cultivar
19. Three Blooms **Daffodil** Division Two white perianth, one cultivar



20. Three Blooms **Daffodil** Division Three, yellow perianth, one cultivar
21. Three Blooms **Daffodil** Division Three, white perianth, one cultivar
22. Three Blooms **Daffodil** Division Four, one cultivar
23. Three Blooms **Daffodil** Division Six, one cultivar
24. Three Blooms **Daffodil** Miniature, one cultivar (from approved list)
25. Three Blooms **Daffodil** Any other division, one cultivar
26. Five Blooms/stems **Daffodil** more than one cultivar, in vase
27. Six vases **Daffodil** One bloom per vase, 6 cultivars, from at least 3 divisions

### Caley Charter Bicentenary Challenge

28. Two vases: **Daffodil** (more than one cultivar per vase)

Vase 1:- 3 blooms with white perianths

Vase 2:- 3 blooms with yellow perianths

30. Three blooms **Daffodil** of one cultivar, registered before 1947, in one vase  
**MUST BE NAMED**

## Section 2 - Bulbs in Pots

One Bowl, Pan or Pot not exceeding 3 litres.

31. Three **Hyacinths**, one cultivar, blue/mauve
32. Three **Hyacinths**, one cultivar, red/pink,
33. Three **Hyacinths**, one cultivar, any other colour



### **Bulbs in Pots continued:**

34. Five **Tulips**, any colour, one cultivar
35. **Tulips** any species or miniature (not less than 5 bulbs)
36. **Daffodils**, Division 1, one cultivar
37. **Daffodils**, Division 2, one cultivar
38. **Daffodils**, Division 3, one cultivar
39. **Daffodils**, Division 4, one cultivar
40. **Daffodils**, Division 6, one cultivar
41. **Daffodils** from Divisions 5, 7, 8, 10, 11 or 12 except miniatures, one cultivar
42. **Daffodils**, Miniature species or hybrids, one cultivar
43. **Daffodils** Division 13, species or natural hybrids

## **Section 3 – Intermediate Classes**

An intermediate entrant is someone who has never won more than three first prizes, or a cup at any spring show in the intermediate, equivalent or open classes in any spring show.

### **Cut Flowers (Intermediate)**

44. One Bloom **Daffodil** Division One
45. One Bloom **Daffodil** Division Two
46. One Bloom **Daffodil** Division Four
47. One Bloom **Daffodil** Division Six
48. One Bloom **Daffodil** Any other division
49. Three Blooms **Daffodil** Division One, one cultivar
50. Three Blooms **Daffodil** Division Two, one cultivar



### **Intermediate Cut flower classes continued:**

51. Three Blooms **Daffodil** Division Four, one cultivar
52. Three Blooms **Daffodil** Division Six, one cultivar
53. Two vases: **Daffodil** One cultivar per vase; two different divisions, 6 blooms (3 blooms per vase)

### **Bulbs in Pots (Intermediate)** One Bowl, Pan or Pot not exceeding 3 litres:

54. **Daffodil**, Division 1, one cultivar
55. **Daffodil**, Divisions 2 one cultivar
56. **Daffodils**, Division 4, one cultivar
57. **Daffodils**, Any other division

## **Section 4 – Novice/Beginner Classes and Under 16s**

A novice/beginner is someone who has not won more than three first prizes or cup at any spring show. **Under 16s may continue to enter the Novice/Beginners class even if they have previously won a cup.**

### **Cut Blooms (Novice)**

58. One Bloom **Daffodil**, Division 1
59. One Bloom **Daffodil**, Division 2
60. Three Blooms **Daffodils**,(one cultivar) any division

### **Bulbs in Pots (Novice)** One Bowl, Pan or Pot not exceeding 3 litres:

61. One pot **Tulips**, any colour
62. One pot **Hyacinths**, any colour

### **Bulbs in Pots (Novice) continued**

63. One pot **Daffodils**, from either Divisions 1 or 2, one cultivar (any colour)
64. One pot **Daffodils; Jetfire** or **Tete a Tete**
65. One pot any other **Bulb, Corm** or **Tuber**



## Section 5 - Other Spring Bulbs

One Bowl, Pan or Pot not exceeding 3 litres













## Section 6 – Others

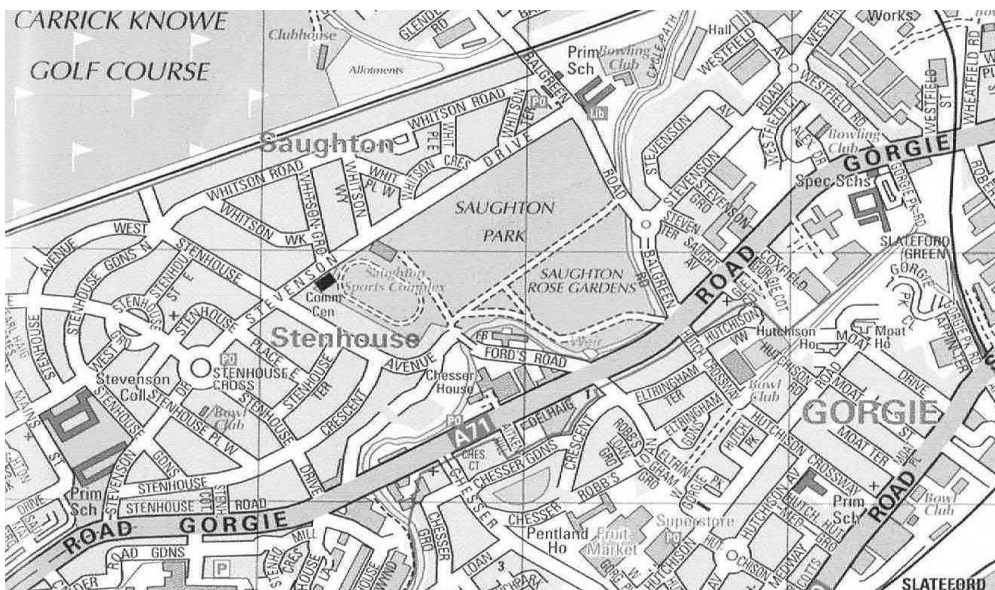
- 71. **Hippeastrum (Amaryllis)** (Pot size not exceeding 3 litres)

From the A71 turn off Gorgie Road at Pure Gym. Take first turning right into Stenhouse Crescent and next turning right at Stenhouse Avenue and follow round to Fords Road – go right through to the end and go through gateway on your left to car park.

From Balgreen Road drive along Stevenson Drive, take first turning left into Stenhouse Avenue follow road round to Fords Road go right to the end and go through the gateway on your left to the car park.

**Please note you cannot access the park car park entrance via the Fords Road access from Gorgie Road.**





## Show Regulations

- 1) Entry for Members and Non-members to all Classes is **free** (donations are welcome).
- 2) Completed Entry Forms can be emailed to [springshow@rchs.co.uk](mailto:springshow@rchs.co.uk), or handed into Saughton, or when staging exhibits on the Friday before the show.
- 3) Staging for all Classes can commence from 12noon on the Friday until 8pm. Parking is available at the Fords Road entrance near the main display area at Saughton.
- 4) All cut flower and exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitors themselves
- 5) A competitor may enter only one exhibit in any one Class
- 6) Except where otherwise stated, all exhibits must be shown in vases supplied by the Show organisers. Staged exhibits can only be moved under the supervision of the Show Co-ordinator.
- 7) Class cards will be provided and should be placed face down beside the exhibit. Cultivars should be named or if not known, labelled "Unknown": labels and wire to hold labels will be supplied by the Society. Pots must be clean and placed on paper plates supplied by the Society.
- 8) Judging will take place between 8.45am and 11:45 on the opening day. There will be strictly no admittance to the marquee during judging.
- 9) Daffodils will be judged in accordance with Daffodil Society rules, with other exhibits judged according to the RHS Horticultural Show Handbook.
- 10) While every reasonable precaution will be taken to safeguard exhibits, the Society cannot accept responsibility for exhibits which are damaged, lost or mislaid during the Show.
- 11) Exhibits not according to Schedule and exhibits deemed unworthy by the Judges, will not be awarded prizes. Plants or material judged to be diseased will be removed. Judges at their discretion may make additional awards where merit warrants, and their decision on merit shall be final.
- 12) Exhibitors are responsible for ensuring removal of their own exhibits **when** the Show closes on the Sunday.
- 13) Any trophies must be returned to the Show Convenor in good order before the 2026 show.
